| | Stateless Persons). |
| Nationality | A legal bond between an individual and a state. It is a form of membership that results in rights and duties (e.g. the right to vote or the duty to pay certain taxes). In some countries, the term "citizenship" is more commonly used to refer to this legal bond. |
| Refugee | A refugee is a person who has fled his or her country owing to well-founded fear of persecution, for instance on the basis of race, religion or political opinion (article 1, 1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees). He or she often has a nationality, but is not safe in that country. However, some refugees are also stateless and the definition of a refugee under international law also allows for this possibility. |
| Internally Displaced | A person who has been forced or obliged to flee or to leave their home or |
| Person (IDP) | place of habitual residence, in particular as a result of or in order to avoid the effects of armed conflict, situations of generalised violence, violations of human rights or natural or human-made disasters, and who has not crossed an internationally recognised state border. |
| Undocumented | A person who does not have any documents to demonstrate identity or nationality. The inability to provide proof of nationality does not make a person stateless. Yet, without identity documents it becomes more difficult for a person to establish his or her bond with a State, which can leave him or her at risk of statelessness. The term "undocumented" is also used in some contexts to describe a person who is in a country without permission / legal residence (also described as "irregular"). |
| At risk of statelessness | The situation in which a person or group is vulnerable to being left without a nationality, for instance due to difficulty proving entitlement to nationality. The term helps to identify where preventative action is needed to protect people from actually becoming stateless. |
| Acquisition of nationality | Process by which a person becomes a national of a country. This may be automatic or upon application; and can occur at birth or later in life. |
| Jus soli | Nationality law rule by which nationality is acquired by virtue of birth on the territory of the state. |
| Jus sanguinis | Nationality law rule by which nationality is acquired by virtue of birth to a parent who is a national of the state. |
| Loss of nationality | Automatic withdrawal of nationality, by operation of the law, following the satisfaction of certain conditions. |
| Deprivation of | Withdrawal of nationality at the initiative of the state – i.e. following a |
| nationality | decision by the competent authority. |
| Birth registration | The official recording of a child's birth by the State. It is a permanent and official record of a child's existence. |
